President's Message— What I have learned as President.

2024 EXPO REPORT

Happy New Year Wisconsin Brown Swiss members! World Dairy Expo has hit their stride once again with strong numbers of cattle housed at 2571, and 374 of those shown in the International Brown Swiss show. The World Premier Brown Swiss Sale averaged \$5649 on 41 lots, which demonstrates a big demand for Brown Swiss. Congratulations to Wisconsin's very own Norman C. Magnusson on being named the 2023 A.C. "Whitie" Thomson Memorial Award recipient! Norm also serves as our Executive Secretary for the National Brown Swiss Association. Wisconsin is chock full of quality Brown Swiss cattle and people. Intermediate Champion of the Show was Topp B-3 Woodford, also Grand Champion of our state show, owned by the Hushon Family and Topp View. The Junior Champion of the Open Show also came from Wisconsin, owned by Siemers Holsteins, she is a Fall Calf Jenlar Rasta Westlynn ETV. Expo has been making some adjustments the past couple of years, to allow for more show ring space to avoid "stacking" of animals, and for judges to get a fair look at each animal. Additionally, there is an effort to avoid very late show conclusions, so the show schedule was shifted a little and start times were moved up just a bit. All in all, the changes were a success. There was little to no "stacking" of animals in the show rings, and shows wrapped up at more reasonable times. For WDE 2024, all show days will be begin at 7am. Your Brown Swiss judges for 2024 will be Phillip Topp and Associate Kaleb Kruse. World Dairy Expo 2024 "The Golden Age" will be October 1st – 4th. Expo would love your feedback on how they can continue to improve in all aspects of the event. Please forward any questions, suggestions, or concerns and I will share those with the board.
